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ORDINANCE, 1977

(Balochistan Ordinance X of 1977)

[7" November, 1977]

An Ordinance to establish Board of Intermediate and
Secondary Education in Balochistan at Quetta.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the
establishment of a Board of Intermediate and Secondary
Education in Balochistan;

AND WHEREAS the Governor is satisfied that
circumstances exist which render it necessary to take
immediate action;

Now THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Proclamation
of the fifth day of July, 1977? read with the Law (Continuance
in Force) Order 1977 (CMLA Order No. 1 of 1977)* and in
exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf the Governor
of Balochistan is pleased to make and promulgate the
following Ordinance: —

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Balochistan
Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education Ordinance,
1977.

(2) It shall extend to the whole Province of
Balochistan except Tribal Areas.

(3) It shall come into force at once and shall be
deemed to have taken effect on 4 October, 1976.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions shall have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say: —

(a) "Board" means the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education constituted under section

This Ordinance, was promulgated by the Governor of Balochistan on 7" November, 1977; published in the Balochistan Gazette (Extraordinary) No. 82, dated 7" November, 1977, Save and validated by Article 270-A of the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan (1973).

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board;

"College" means an institution within the jurisdiction of the Board and recognised by it for Intermediate Education, and includes a college having Intermediate and Degree classes and affiliated to the University of Balochistan for the Degree classes;

"Committee" means a committee constituted under this Ordinance;

"Controller of Examinations" means the Controller of Examinations of the Board;

"Controlling Authority" means the Controlling Authority specified in section 12 of this Ordinance;

"Government" means the Government of Balochistan;

"Head of an Institution" means the Principal of a College or the Headmaster or Headmistress of a school;

"Institution" means a college or a school;

"Intermediate College" means an_ institution recognised for imparting instruction to Class XI and Class XII, and includes an_ institution having classes for Intermediate and Secondary Education;

"Intermediate Education" means education pertaining to Classes XI and XII;

"University" means the University of Balochistan;

"Quetta Board" means the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Quetta;

"Prescribed" means prescribed by regulations or rules;

"Principal" means the Head of a College;

"Recognised" means recognised by the Board;

"School" means an_ institution within the

Jurisdiction of the Board and recognised by it only for Secondary Education;

(r) "Regulations and Rules" means respectively the regulations and rules made under this Ordinance;

(s) "Secondary Education" means Education pertaining to Class IX and Class X and such other classes as may be declared by Government to be classes of Secondary Education;

(t) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board;

(u) "Schedule" means the Schedule appended to the Ordinance.

Incorporation. 3. The Board shall be a body corporate and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal with powers to acquire, hold property and to transfer the same and may sue or be sued by its corporate name.

Jurisdiction. 4. The Board shall exercise the powers conferred on it by or under this Ordinance in respect of the institutions within the Province of Balochistan over which the University of Balochistan was exercising its powers under the University of Balochistan Act, 1970¹, immediately before the coming into force of the Ordinance.

5. As from the date of commencement of this Ordinance the University of Balochistan shall cease to exercise any power within the Province of Balochistan in respect of the institutions imparting Secondary and Intermediate Education within the said Province.

The Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, authorise University of Balochistan to exercise the powers of the Board under this Ordinance for a period not exceeding one year from the date of commencement of this Ordinance in respect of such matters and institutions as may be specified in the said notification.

Constitution of the 6. (1) The Board shall consist of the following Board. members, namely: —

(1) Chairman.

(i1) A University Professor nominated by the Vice Chancellor of the University of Balochistan.

(ii) The Director of Education in Balochistan.

(iv) The Principal, Government Polytechnic Institute, Quetta.

(v) One representative of the syndicate of the University.

(vi) One Principal of a College nominated by the Controlling Authority.

(vii) One representative of Heads. of Intermediate Colleges to be elected by the Principals from amongst themselves.

(viii) One representative of Headmasters/ Headmistress to be elected by the Headmasters/Headmistresses from amongst themselves.

(ix) Two persons nominated by the Controlling Authority.

(2) The names of the nominated members shall be notified in the official gazette.

(3) The term of office of members other than the Ex-officio members shall be two years.

(4) | No member appointed by virtue of his office shall continue to be a member of any of the committees of which he may be member.

(5) When a person ceases to be a member of a Board, he shall cease to be member of any of the committees of which he may be a member.

7. A member of the Board may resign his membership by

a letter addressed to the Chairman provided that the resignation shall not take effect until it is accepted by the Controlling Authority.

8. (1) A member of the Board shall be liable to be removed by the Controlling Authority if he: —

unless the member has been given an opportunity of being

(2) The decision of the Controlling Authority
removing a member from his office under subsection (1) shall
be final and shall not be questioned by or before any Court or
other Authority.

9. (1) Whenever there occurs a vacancy in the
membership of the Board due to death, resignation or removal,
it shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of this
Ordinance.

(2) The person who fills the vacancy shall be a
member of the Board for the full term of two years.

10. (1) The Chairman may, whenever he considers
necessary, and shall on a requisition from at least five
members of the Board, call a meeting of the Board.

(2) The quorum for meetings of the Board shall be
five.

11. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance the
Board shall have powers to organise regulate, develop and
control Intermediate Education and Secondary Education.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the
generality of the powers conferred by the preceding sub-
section the Board shall have the powers: —

(1) to hold and conduct all examinations
pertaining to Intermediate Education,
Secondary Education, Pakistan and
classical languages & such _ other
examinations as may be determined by
Government;

(ii) to prescribe courses of study for its

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examinations;

to lay down conditions for recognition of institutions;

to accord, refuse or withdraw recognition, wholly or partly: —

(a) in case of schools maintained by the Government of Pakistan, after considering inspection reports from the Officer appointed for the purpose by the Director of Education;

(b) in the case of other schools, after considering inspection reports from the Inspection Committee appointed by the Board for the purpose;

(c) in the case of Intermediate Colleges after considering reports from an_ Inspection

Committee appointed by the Board in this behalf;

to inspect and arrange for inspection of recognized institutions and call for inspection reports in respect of such institutions, other than the institutions run by the Government of Pakistan;

to lay down conditions for admission to its examinations, to determine the eligibility of candidates and to admit

them to such examinations;

to grant certificates and diplomas to persons who have _ passed its examinations and to withdraw such certificates and diplomas;

to fix, demand and receive such fees as may be prescribed;

to supervise the residence, health and discipline of the students of recognized institutions with a view to promoting

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their general welfare;

to institute and award scholarships,
medals and prizes in accordance with
the regulations and rules;

to organize and promote extra moral
activities in and for recognised
institutions;

to hold, control and administer its
property and fund;

to enter into and carry out contracts in
exercise of its powers and in the
performance of its duties under this
Ordinance and the regulations;

to pass its annual budget;

to transfer any movable and immovable
property belonging to it;

to hold and manage endowments;

to regulate and decide all administrative
matters including the creation and

abolition of posts under the Board with the prior approval of the Controlling Authority;

to appoint such officers and staff as it may consider necessary for the performance of its functions and define their duties and conditions of service.

to make provision for buildings, premises, furniture, apparatus, books and other means required for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance;

to sanction or incur such expenditure as may be necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance and

to do all other acts necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance.

The Board may delegate any of its powers to its Chairman or any officer of the Board or to a committee or sub-

committee appointed by it, as it may deem fit.

12. The Government of Balochistan shall be the
Controlling Authority of the Board.

13. (1) The Controlling Authority shall have the power
to cause an inspection to be made, by such person or persons
as it may direct, of the offices, activities and funds of, and to
cause an enquiry to be made in like manner in respect of any
matter concerning the Board.

(2) The Controlling Authority shall communicate
to the Board the results of such inspection or enquiry and may
advise the Board to take such action and within such period as
may be specified.

(3) The Board shall report to the Controlling
Authority the action it proposes to take or has taken on such
communication.

(4) Where the Board does not within a reasonable
time take action to the satisfaction of the Controlling
Authority, the Controlling Authority may after considering any
explanation made by the Board, issue such directions as it
thinks fit, and the Chairman shall comply with such directions.

(5) If the Controlling Authority is satisfied that any
proceeding of the Board or a committee is not in conformity
with this Ordinance the Controlling Authority may, without
prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this section, by order
in writing annul such proceedings:

Provided that before making any such order, the
Controlling Authority shall, through the Chairman, call upon
the Board or the Committee, as the case may be, to show cause
as to why such an order should not be made.

(6) The Controlling Authority may, from time to
time, direct the Board to conduct its affairs and to perform its
functions in such manner as may be specified.

(7) The Controlling Authority may, require the
Board to furnish it with: —

(i) any return, statement, estimate, statistics or other information regarding any matter under the control of the Board; or

(i1) a report on any such matter; or

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(iii) a copy of any document in the charge of the Board; and the Chairman shall comply with every such requisition.

T(8) The Controlling Authority shall have the powers to place the services of any of the officers or other employees of the Board at the disposal of Government or other institution for such period and on such terms and conditions as may be determined by it:

Provided that such terms and conditions shall not be less favourable than those admissible to him immediately before his transfer.]

14. The following shall be the officers of the Board: —

(1) The Chairman;
(i1) The Secretary;
(iii) The Controller of Examinations; and

(iv) — such other officers as may be appointed by the Board.

15. (1) The Chairman shall be a whole time officer and shall be appointed by the Controlling Authority on such terms and conditions as may be determined by the Controlling Authority.

(2) The Chairman shall hold office for a term of three years from the date of notification of his appointment and on the expiry of the term of office shall be eligible for re-appointment for such further period, not exceeding three years, as may be specified in the order of re-appointment:

Provided that the Controlling Authority may, at any time, review the work of the Chairman and if on such review it is satisfied that in the interest of the Board, or for any other sufficient cause, it is necessary to do so, it may, after giving the Chairman an opportunity of showing cause against the proposed action, reduce the term of office of the Chairman to such period as it may determine.

(3) If at any time the office of the Chairman is vacant temporarily or otherwise, by reason of leave, illness or other cause, for a period not exceeding one year, the

Controlling Authority shall take such arrangements for

carrying out the duties of the office of the Chairman as it may think fit.

(4) The Chairman shall be the principal executive and academic officer of the Board and shall, when present, preside at the meetings of:—

(1) The Board

(i1) The Committees of the Board constituted under section 18.

(5) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to ensure that the provisions of this Ordinance and the regulations and rules are faithfully observed and carried out, and he shall exercise all powers necessary for this purpose.

(6) The Chairman may create a temporary post under the Board for a period not exceeding six months.

(7) In any emergency arising out of the administrative business of the Board and requiring, in the opinion of the Chairman, immediate action, the Chairman may take such action as he may deem necessary and shall report the action taken to the Board at its next meeting for approval.

(8) The Chairman shall exercise such other powers as may be prescribed by regulations.

16. (1) The Secretary and the Controller of Examinations shall be whole-time salaried officers of the Board and shall be appointed by the Controlling Authority.

(2) The terms and conditions of service of the Secretary and the Controller of Examinations and their powers and duties shall be such as may be prescribed by regulations.

17. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance the powers and duties of other officers of the Board shall be such as may be determined by the Board.

18. (1) The Board shall have the following Committees
namely: —

- (1) The Academic Committee;
- (i1) The Finance Committee;
- (ii) |The Appointments Committee;
- (iv) Committee for appointments of Paper

(v) Committees of Courses; and

(vi) Such other Committees as may be
prescribed by regulations.

(2) The Board or a Committee may appoint such
Sub-Committees as It may deem necessary.

19. The constitution, functions and duties of Committees
shall be such as may be prescribed by regulations.

20. (1) The Board, may, subject to the approval of
Government, frame 'regulations not inconsistent with the
provisions of this Ordinance to carry out the purposes of this
Ordinance.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the
generality of the foregoing powers, such regulations may
provide for —

(a) the terms and conditions of service of
the employees of the Board, including
matters relating to taking of disciplinary
action against, grant of leave to, and
retirement of, such employees;

(b) the constitution of pension or Provident
Fund or both for the benefit of the
officers and other employees of the
Board;

(c) the admission of institutions to the
privilege of recognition; and_ the
withdrawal of recognition;

(d) a general scheme of studies, including
the total number of subjects to be taught
and the duration of courses; and

(e) all other matters required under any of the provisions of this Ordinance to be provided in the regulations.

21. The Board may make rules consistent with this Ordinance and the regulations to provide for:

(1) The inspection of institutions and the reports, returns and other information to be furnished by them;

(i1) The conditions of admission of candidates to the examinations held by it, and their eligibility for diploma certificates and titles;

(iii) The manner and the form in which accounts of the Board shall be maintained; and

(iv) Such other matters as may be required under the regulations to be provided in the rules.

22. The Board shall have a fund to which shall be credited all its income, including income from fees, endowments, grants, Benevolent Fund, group insurance, contributions etc.

23. (1) The accounts of the Board shall be maintained in such form and in such manner as may be prescribed by rules.

(2) The accounts of the Board shall be audited in such manner as may be prescribed by regulations.

(3) The Board shall, as soon as possible after the end of every financial year, submit to the Government, the annual statement of the accounts of the Board duly audited, together with the report of the auditor.

24. (1) The Board shall establish for the benefit of its employees such pension or provident fund or both as may deem fit in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by regulations.

(2) Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, declare that the provisions of the Provident Fund Act, 1925 (Act XIX of 1925) shall apply to a Provident Fund established by the Board and on the making of such

declaration that Act shall apply as if such Board were Government and the said fund were the Government provident fund.

25. The Board shall submit to the Controlling Authority, as soon as possible after the end of every financial year but not latter than the 30th September, a report on the conduct of its affairs for that year.

26. (1) No member of the Board shall draw any fee or

other remuneration in any capacity whatever from the funds of the Board or enter into any contract with the Board directly or through any other person in connection with the affairs of the Board, Provided that the emoluments of the Chairman shall be paid from funds of the Board in accordance with the terms and conditions of his appointment.

(2) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to prohibit a member of a committee from the Board, remuneration in lump sum for writing, compiling or editing a book intended to be prescribed for an examination of the Board.

27. No person who has any financial interest in any book prescribed by the Board as a course of study for any examination conducted by such Board or has a financial interest as a partner or otherwise in any firm which publishes, procures or supplies any such book, shall be eligible to become a member of such Board or a Committee or Sub-Committee thereof or continues as such after having acquired any such interest.

28. No act or proceedings of the Board or any committee shall be invalid merely by reason of the existence of a vacancy on the Board or the Committee as the case may be, or by member of the Board or the Committee.

29. No acts done, orders passed or proceedings taken by the Board in pursuance of this Ordinance shall be called in

question in any court by a Suit or otherwise.

30. | Members of the Board and committees, the employees of the Board and other persons appointed for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of section 21 of the Pakistan Penal Code (Act XIV of 1860).

31. No suit for damages or other legal proceedings shall be instituted against Government, the Controlling Authority, the Board, any committee, any member of the Board or Committee or officer or employee of the Board in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in good faith in pursuance of this Ordinance and the regulations and rules made thereunder.

32. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in

this Ordinance: —

(a) The Regulations set out in the schedule shall be deemed to be the first Regulations framed by the Board under section 20; and

(b) Government may frame regulations, and the regulations so framed shall become a part of the schedule.

33. (1) From the date of commencement of this Ordinance and till such time as the nominated and elected members are appointed, the Chairman and the ex-officio members shall exercise all the powers and perform all the duties of the Board and its Committees.

(2) On the appointment of nominated and elected members, the Board shall exercise all powers and perform all duties of the committees of the Board till such time as the committees are constituted.

(3) If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Ordinance, the Controlling Authority may take such action to remove the difficulty as in the circumstances of the case it may deem necessary.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contrary in the Ordinance the Controlling Authority may create posts or may appoint the first Chairman, the first Secretary, the first Controller of Examinations and any other officer for a period not exceeding two years.

34. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Ordinance, everything done, action taken, jurisdiction or power conferred, recognition granted, and order issued under any of the provisions of the University of Balochistan Ordinance, 1970 (Balochistan Ordinance I of 1970) and the regulations and rules made thereunder, shall if not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance be continued and, so far as may be, deemed to have been respectively done, taken, conferred, granted and issued under this Ordinance.

the Board as its principal executive academic officer and shall do all acts to ensure that the officers and the staff properly perform the duties entrusted them.

In particular he shall: —

- (i) write confidential reports on the work of officers whose grades carry an initial salary of four hundred rupees or more per mensem;
- (ii) recommend to the Board any disciplinary action that he considers necessary against officers mentioned in clause (1);
- (iii) take disciplinary action against members of the establishment whose grades carry an initial pay, or less than four hundred rupees per mensem;
and
- (iv) appoint superintendents of Examinations and Sub-Examiners.

2. (1) The Secretary shall, subject to the control of the Chairman, be incharge of the academic and administrative sector of the Board's office, and cause the orders and decisions of the Board and the Chairman to be carried out.

(2) The Secretary shall take all possible steps to ensure that the funds of the Board are spent on the purpose for which they are provided.

(3) The Secretary shall cause to be prepared and submit to the Board for approval the annual statements of accounts and budget estimate.

(4) All meetings of the Board and the Committees shall be convened by the Secretary under the direction of the Chairman while preparing the agenda for a meeting of the

Board or a committee the Secretary shall carry out the directions of the Chairman given in this respect and no item shall be placed on such agenda or be considered in the meeting

without previous permission of the Chairman.

(5) The Secretary shall record the minutes and maintain the records of the proceedings of the Board and the Committees.

(6) The Secretary shall conduct the official correspondence of the Board under the authority of the Chairman except the correspondence relating to the conduct of the Examinations.

(7) All fees and dues payable to the Board and all sums received by the Secretary, shall be credited without delay to the account of the Board, in a bank approved by the Board.

(8) The Secretary shall issue to successful candidates on behalf of the Board in the prescribed form certificates of having passed the Examinations held by the Board.

(9) The Secretary shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Chairman.

(10) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these regulations, the Board may assign to any other officer or officers such duties of the Secretary as it may deem necessary.

(11) The post of the Secretary shall be a tenure post. The term of his appointment shall be three years and may be renewed.

3. The Controller of Examinations shall, subject to the control of the Chairman, be incharge of the Examinations sector of the Board and shall;

(i) Make arrangements for the conduct of examinations of the Board;

(ii) | Conduct official correspondence of the Board relating to the Examinations; and

(iii) | Perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Chairman from time to time.

4. (1) The Academic, committee shall consist of: —

- (i) The Chairman of the Board.
- (ii) The Director of Education, Balochistan.
- (iii) | A University Professor nominated by the

(e) Other Languages.

Members of the Board of Studies of the

The Academic Committees shall have the
general superintendence and control of, and the
responsibility for the maintenance of the
standards of teaching and examinations.

(i) Determine the subject or subjects which
shall be assigned to each committee of
Courses.

(ii) | Advise the Board on the qualifications of the teachers and examiners, their duties and conditions of appointment.

(iii) Advise the Board on all academic scheme of studies for an examination, the number of subjects to be included in an examination, the value of each subject in respect of marks to be assigned to it, and the conditions to be fulfilled for being placed in a particular division; and

(2) The Appointment Committee shall recommend the appointment, confirmation and the scale of pay of officers and employees of the Board whose scales of pay carry an initial pay of four hundred rupees or more per mensem.

(3) The members of the Appointment Committee other than the ex-officio members, shall hold office for two years.

(4) The quorum for a meeting of the Appointments Committee shall be three.

(3) Each committee of courses shall consider
academic matters relating to the subject or subjects with which
it is concerned and shall recommend to the Academic
Committee the courses of study and text books to be
prescribed as well as the conditions to be fulfilled by the
candidates for passing the relevant examination in the subject
or subjects.

(4) Each committee of courses shall have a
Convener who shall be nominated by the Board.

(5) The quorum for a Committee of Courses shall
be four.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in these
Regulations, when a person ceases to be member of a
committee shall cease to be member of any sub-committee of
which he may be a member by virtue of his membership of
that committee.

10. (1) The Board shall accord recognition for the
Secondary School and Intermediate Examination, to such
Schools and Colleges as are within the jurisdiction of the
Board, if it is satisfied, on the basis of the inspection report
received from the Officer appointed for the purpose by the
Director of Education.

(2) If the Board on the basis of a report received
from the officer appointed for the purpose by the Director of
Education is satisfied that the conditions of recognition have
ceased to be fulfilled by any School/College recognised by it,

the Board may, after giving the management of the school / college an opportunity of being heard, cancel the recognition.

(3) This may if it considers necessary, arrange special inspection of any school/ college by an Inspection Committee appointed by it.

Auditor.

11. (1) The Board shall appoint a whole-time Audit Officer as Auditor for the purpose of auditing the accounts, and the bills to be paid from the funds of the Board, unless the bill for its payment has been audited by the Auditor in conformity with the regulations and rules.

(2) The statement of accounts of the Board, signed by the Secretary and the Auditor, shall be submitted to Government within six months of the closing of the financial year.

(3) The accounts of the Board shall be audited once a year, in conformity with the regulations and rules by Auditors appointed by Government for this purpose.
