An Ordinance to establish a Board of Intermediate and  
Secondary' Education at Quetta.

Preamble. WHEREAS it is expedient to establish a Board of  
Intermediate and Secondary Education at Quetta;

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Martial Law  
Proclamation of 25" March 1969, read with the Provisional  
Constitution Order, and in exercise of all powers enabling him  
in that behalf, the Governor of West Pakistan is pleased to make  
and promulgate the following Ordinance:—

Short title and 1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the \*[Balochistan]  
commencemen Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education (Quetta)  
t Ordinance, 1969.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

Definition. 2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires,  
the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby  
respectively assigned to them, that is to say—

(a) "Board" means the Board of Intermediate and  
Secondary Education (Quetta), constituted under  
section 3;

(b) "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board;

(c) "College" means an institution within the  
jurisdiction of the Board and recognized by it for  
Intermediate Education, and includes a college  
having Intermediate and Degree classes and  
affiliated to the University for the Degree  
classes;

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"Committee" means a committee constituted under this Ordinance;

"Controller of Examinations" means \_ the Controller of Examinations of the Board;

"Controlling Authority" means the Controlling Authority specified in section 12;

"Government" means the Government of 'TBalochistan];

"Head of an institution" means the principal of a college or the headmaster or headmistress of a school, as the case may be;

"Institution" means a college or a school;

"Intermediate College" means an\_ institution recognized for imparting instruction to class XI and class XII, and includes an institution having classes, for Intermediate and Secondary Education;

"Intermediate Education" means \_ education

pertaining to class XI and class XI;

"Multan Board" means the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education, Multan;

"prescribed" means prescribed by regulations or rules;

"Principal" means the head of a college;

"Recognized" means recognized by the Board;

"School" means an institution within the jurisdiction of the Board and recognized by it only for Secondary education;

"Regulations" and "rules" means respectively, the regulations and rules made or deemed to be made under this Ordinance;

"Secondary Education" means \_ education pertaining to class IX and class X and such other classes as may be declared by Government to be classes of Secondary Education;

"Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board;

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and

(t) "University" means the University of the Punjab.

Establishment and 3. (1) As soon as may be, there shall be constituted and incorporation established at Quetta a Board called the Board of Intermediate of the Board. and Secondary Education, Quetta.

(2) The Board shall be a body corporate and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal with power to acquire and hold property and to transfer the same and may sue or be sued by its corporate name.

Jurisdiction of the 4. (1) The Quetta Board shall exercise the powers Board. conferred on it by or under this Ordinance, in respect of the institutions within the Division of Quetta and Kalat, for which the Multan Board was exercising its powers under the West Pakistan Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education (Multan and Sargodha) Ordinance, 1968, immediately before

the coming into force of this Ordinance.

(2) Government may, by general or special orders modify the jurisdiction of the Board with regard to such territorial limits or institutions.

Cessor jurisdiction 5. As from the date of commencement of this Ordinance, of the Multan — the Multan Board shall cease to exercise any powers within the Board. Divisions of Quetta and Kalat and in respect of the institutions

within the said Divisions:

Provided that Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, authorize the Multan Board to exercise the powers of the Board under this Ordinance, for a period not exceeding six months from the date of commencement of this Ordinance in respect of such matters as may be specified in the said notification.

Constitution of the 6. (1) The Board shall consist of the following Board. members, namely:—

(i) Chairman:

(i1) the Vice-Chancellor of the University or a University Professor nominated by him;

(iii) the Director of Education, Quetta;

(iv) the Principal, Government Polytechnic Institute, Quetta;

(v) one principal of a college nominated by  
the Controlling Authority;

(vi) one representative of the principals of  
Intermediate colleges elected by and from  
amongst themselves;

(vii) one representative of headmasters and  
headmistresses of schools elected by and  
from amongst themselves;

(viii) two persons nominated by \_ the  
Controlling Authority.

(2) The name of the nominated and elected members  
shall be notified in the Official Gazette.

(3) The term of office of members other than the ex-  
officio members shall be two years.

(4) No member appointed by virtue of his office  
shall continue to be a member if he ceases to hold that office.

(5) When a person ceases to be a member of the  
Board, he shall cease to be a member of any of the committees  
of which he may be a member.

7. A member of the Board may resign his membership by a  
letter addressed to the Chairman; provided that the resignation  
shall not have effect until it is accepted by the Controlling  
Authority.

8. (1) A member of the Board shall be liable to be  
removed by the Controlling Authority if—

(i) he becomes of unsound mind;

(ii) he is declared insolvent by a competent  
Court;

(iii) he is convicted by a Criminal Court of an  
offence involving moral turpitude.

(2) The decision of the Controlling Authority removing a member from his office under sub-section (1) shall be final and shall not be question by or before court or other authority.

9. (1) Whenever there occurs a vacancy in the membership of the Board due to death, resignation or removal; it shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of this

(2) The person who fills the vacancy shall be a member of the Board for the full term of two years.

10. (1) The Chairman may, whenever he considers it necessary, and shall, on a requisition from at least five members of the Board, call a meeting of the Board.

(2) The quorum for meeting of the Board shall be five.

11. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, the Board shall have power to organize, regulate, develop and control Intermediate education and Secondary education.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the power conferred by the preceding sub-section, the Board shall have the power—

(i) to hold and conduct all examinations pertaining to Intermediate education, Secondary education, Pakistani and classical languages, and such \_ other examinations as may be determined by Government;

(ii) to prescribe courses of study for its examinations;

(iii) to lay down conditions for recognition of institutions;

(iv) to accord, refuse or withdraw recognition, wholly or partly;

(a) in the case of schools maintained by the Government of Pakistan, after considering \_ inspection reports from the Officer on Special Duty, Ministry of Education, Government of Pakistan, or any other authority appointed for the purpose by the said Ministry;

(b) in the case of other schools, after considering inspection reports from the Divisional Inspectors of Schools or the Divisional

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Inspectresses of Schools of the  
Division concerned; and

(c) in the case of Intermediate  
colleges and institutions preparing  
candidates for languages  
examinations, after considering  
reports from an \_ Inspection  
Committee appointed by the  
Board in this behalf;

to inspect and arrange for inspection of  
recognized institutions and call for  
inspection reports in respect of such  
institutions, other than the institutions run  
by the Government of Pakistan;

to lay down conditions for admission to  
its examinations to determine the  
eligibility of candidates and to admit  
them to such examinations;

to grant certificates and diplomas to  
persons who have passed its  
examinations and to withdraw such  
certificates and diplomas;

to fix, demand and receive such fees as  
may be prescribed;

to supervise the residence, health and  
discipline of the students of recognized  
institutions with a view to promoting

their general welfare;

to institute and award scholarships,  
medals and prizes in accordance with the  
regulations and rules;

to organize and promote extra moral  
activities in and for recognized  
institutions;

to hold, control and administer its

property and funds;

to enter into and carry out contracts in  
exercise of its powers and in the  
performance of its duties under this

## Controlling Authority

### Powers of the Controlling Authority.

(xiv) to pass its annual budget;

(xv) to transfer any movable and immovable  
property belonging to it;

(xvi) to hold and manage endowments;

(xvii) to regulate and decide all administrative  
matters, including the creation and  
abolition of posts under the Board;

(xviii) to appoint such officers and staff as it may  
consider necessary for the performance of  
its functions and define their duties and  
conditions of service;

(xix) to make provision for buildings,  
premises, furniture, apparatus, books and  
other means required for carrying out the  
purposes of this Ordinance;

(xx) to sanction or incur such expenditure as  
may be necessary for carrying out the  
purposes of this Ordinance; and

(xxi) to do all other acts necessary for carrying  
out the purposes of this Ordinance.

(3) The Board may delegate any of its powers to its  
Chairman or any officer of the Board or to a committee or sub-  
committee appointed by it, as it may deem fit.

12. The Governor of '[Balochistan] or his nominee shall be  
the Controlling Authority of the Board.

13. (1) The Controlling Authority shall have the power  
to cause an inspection to be made, by such person or persons as  
it may direct, of the offices, activities and funds of, and the  
examinations conducted by, the Board, and to cause an enquiry  
to be made in like manner in respect of any matter concerning  
the Board.



(2) The Controlling Authority shall communicate to the Board the result of such inspection or enquiry and may advise the Board to take such action and within such period as may be specified by it.

(3) The Board shall report to the Controlling Authority the action it proposes to take or has taken on such communication.

(4) Where the Board does not within a reasonable time take action to the satisfaction of the Controlling Authority, the Controlling Authority may, after considering any explanation given by the Board, issue such directions as it thinks fit, and the Chairman shall comply with such directions.

(5) If the controlling Authority is satisfied that any proceeding of the Board or a committee is not in conformity with this Ordinance, the Controlling Authority may, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this section, by order in writing, annul such proceedings:

Provided that before making any such order, the Controlling Authority shall, through the Chairman, call upon the Board or the committee, as the case may be, to show cause why such an order should not be made.

(6) The Controlling Authority may, from time to time, direct the Board to conduct its affairs and to perform its functions in such manner as may be specified.

(7) The Controlling Authority may require the Board to furnish it with—

(i) any return, statement, estimate, statistics or other information regarding any matter under the control of the Board; or

(i1) a report on any such matter; or

(iii) | a copy of any document in the charge of the Board;

and the Chairman shall comply with every such requisition.

14. — The following shall be the officers of the Board:—

(i) the Chairman;

(i1) the Secretary;

(iii) — the Controller of Examinations; and

(iv) such other officers as may be appointed by the Board.

15. (1) The Chairman shall be appointed by the  
Controlling Authority on such terms and conditions as may be

determined by the Controlling Authority.

(2) The Chairman shall hold office for a term of four years from the date of notification of his appointment and on the expiry of the term of office shall be eligible for re-appointment for such further period, not exceeding four years, as may be specified in the order of re-appointment:

Provided that the Controlling Authority may, at any time, review the work of the Chairman and if on such review it is satisfied that in the interest of the Board, or for any other sufficient cause, it is necessary so to do, it may, after giving the Chairman an opportunity of showing cause against the proposed action, reduce the term of office of the Chairman to such period as it may determine.

(3) If at any time the office of the Chairman is vacant, temporarily or otherwise, by reason of leave, illness or other cause, for a period not exceeding one year, the Controlling Authority shall make such arrangements for carrying on the duties of the office of the Chairman as it may think fit.

(4) The Chairman shall be the principal executive and academic officer of the Board and shall, when present, preside at the meetings of—

(i) the Board;

(ii) the committees of the Board constituted, under section 18.

(5) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to ensure that the provisions of this Ordinance and the regulations and rules are faithfully observed and carried out, and he shall exercise all powers necessary for this purpose.

(6) The Chairman may create a temporary post under the Board for a period not exceeding six months.

(7) In any emergency arising out of the administrative business of the Board and requiring, in the opinion of the Chairman, immediate action, the Chairman may take such action as he may deem necessary and shall report the action taken to the Board at its next meeting for approval.

(8) The Chairman shall exercise such other powers as may be prescribed by regulations.

16. (1) The Secretary and the Controller of

Examinations shall be whole-time salaried officers of the Board and shall be appointed by it.

(2) The terms and conditions of service of the Secretary and the Controller of Examinations and their powers and duties shall be such as may be prescribed by regulations.

17. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, the powers and duties of other officers of the Board shall be such as may be determined by the Board.

18. (1) The Board shall have the following committees, namely:—

(i) the Academic Committee;

(ii) the Finance Committee;

(iii) the Appointments Committee;

(iv) Committee for Appointment of Paper Setters and Head Examiners;

(v) Committee of Courses; and

(vi) such other committees as may be

prescribe by regulations.

(2) The Board or a committee may appoint such sub-committees as it may deem necessary.

19. The constitution, functions and duties of committees shall be such as may be prescribed by regulations.

20. (1) The Board may, subject to the approval of Government, frame regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such regulations may provide for—

(i) the terms and conditions of service of the employees of the Board,  
matters relating to taking of disciplinary action against, grant of leave to, and retirement of, such employees;

including

(i1) the constitution of pension or Provident

Fund or both for the benefit of the officers and other employees of the Board;

(iii) the admission of institutions to the privilege of recognition and\_ the withdrawal of recognition;

(iv) a general scheme of studies, including the total number of subjects to be taught and the duration of courses; and

(v) all other matters required under any of the provisions of this Ordinance to be provided in the regulations.

22. The Board shall have a fund to which shall be credited all its income, including income from fees, endowments, grants and contributions.

23. (1) The accounts of the Board shall be maintained in such form and in such manner as may be prescribed by rules.



(2) The accounts of the Board shall be audited in such manner as may be prescribed by regulations.

(3) The Board shall, as soon as possible after the end of every financial year, submit to Government, the annual statement of the accounts of the Board duly audited, together with the report of the auditor.

24. (1) The Board shall establish for the benefit of its employees such pension or Provident Fund or both as it may

deem fit, in such manner, and subject to such conditions, as  
may be prescribed by regulations.

(2) Government may, by notification in the official  
Gazette, declare that the provisions of the Provident Fund Act,  
1925 (Act XI of 1925), shall apply to a Provident Fund  
established by the Board, and on the making of such declaration  
that Act shall apply as if the Board were Government and the  
said fund were the Government Provident Fund.

25. The Board shall submit to the Controlling Authority, as  
soon as possible after the end of every financial year but not  
later than the 30<sup>th</sup> September, a report on the conduct of its  
affairs for that year.

26. (1) No member of the Board shall draw any fee or  
other remuneration in any capacity whatever

from the funds of the Board or enter into any contract with the  
Board, directly or through any other person, in connection with  
the affairs of the Board:

Provided that the emoluments of the Chairman  
shall be paid from the funds of the Board in accordance with the  
terms and conditions of his appointment.

(2) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to  
prohibit a member of a committee from receiving from the  
Board, remuneration in lump sum for writing, compiling or  
editing a book intended to be prescribed for an examination of  
the Board.

27. No person who has any financial interest in any examination conducted by the Board or has a financial interest as a partner or otherwise in any firm which publishes, procures or supplies any such book, shall be eligible to become a member of the Board or a committee thereof or continue as such after having acquired any such interest.

28. No act or proceedings of the Board or any committee shall be invalid merely by reasons of the existence of a vacancy on the Board or the committee, as the case may be, or by reason of any irregularity in the appointment of any member of the Board or the Committee.

29. No acts done, orders passed or proceedings taken by the Board in pursuance of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be

called in question in any Court by a suit or otherwise.

30. Members of the Board and the committees, the employees of the Board and other persons appointed for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance, shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of section 21 of the Pakistan Penal Code (Act XLV of 1860).

31. No suit for damages or other legal proceedings shall be instituted against Government, the Controlling Authority, the Board, any committee, any member of the Board or committee or officer or employee of the Board in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in good faith in pursuance of this Ordinance or the regulations and rules made thereunder.

32. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Ordinance—

(a) the Regulations set out in the Schedule shall be deemed to be the First Regulations framed by the Board under section 20;

(b) Government may, within a period of three months from the date of commencement of this Ordinance, frame regulations, and the regulations so framed shall become part of the Schedule.

33. (1) From the date of commencement of this Ordinance and till such time as the nominated and elected members are appointed, the Chairman and the ex-officio members shall exercise all the powers and perform all the duties of the Board and its committees.

(2) On the appointment of the nominated and elected members, the Board shall exercise all powers and perform all duties of the committees of the Board till such time as the committees are constituted.

(3) If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Ordinance, the Controlling Authority may take such action to remove the difficulty as in the circumstances of the case it may deem necessary.

34. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 5 of this Ordinance, everything done, action taken, jurisdiction or power conferred, recognition granted, and order issued under any of the provisions of the West Pakistan Boards of Intermediate and Secondary Education (Multan and Sargodha) Ordinance, 1968

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(West Pakistan Ordinance VII of 1968), and the regulations and rules made thereunder, shall, if not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance and the regulations and rules made thereunder, be continued and, so far as may be, be deemed to have been respectively done, taken, conferred, granted and issued under this Ordinance and the regulations and rules made thereunder.

## SCHEDULE

### THE FIRST REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD

(See Section 32)

1. The Chairman shall exercise control over the office of the Board as its principal executive and academic officer and shall do all acts to ensure that the officers and the staff properly perform the duties entrusted to them. In particular he shall—

(i) write confidential reports on the work of officers whose grades carry an initial salary of three hundred rupees or more per mensem;

(i1) recommend to the Board any disciplinary action that he considers necessary against officers mentioned in clause (1);

(iii) take disciplinary action against members of the establishment whose grades carry an initial pay of less than three hundred rupees per mensem; and

(iv) appoint Superintendents of Examinations.

2. (1) The Secretary shall, subject to the control, of the Chairman, be in charge of the academic and administrative sector of the Board's Office and cause the orders and decisions of the Board and the Chairman to be carried out.

(2) The Secretary shall take all possible steps to ensure that the funds of the Board are spent on the purpose for which they are provided.

(3) The Secretary shall, cause to be prepared and submit to the Board for approval the annual statement of accounts and budget estimates.

(4) All meetings of the Board and the committee shall be convened by the Secretary under the direction of the Chairman. While preparing the agenda for a meeting of the Board or a committee, the Secretary shall carry out the directions of the Chairman given in this respect and no item

shall be placed on such agenda or be considered in the meeting without the previous permission of the Chairman.

(5) The Secretary shall record the minutes and maintain the records of the proceedings of the Board and the committees.

(6) The Secretary shall conduct the official correspondence of the Board under the authority of the Chairman except the correspondence relating to the conduct of examinations.

(7) All fees and dues payable to the Board, and all sums received by the Secretary, shall be credited without delay to the account of the Board in a Government Treasury or a bank approved by the Board.

(8) The Secretary shall issue to \_ successful candidates on behalf of the Board in the prescribed form certificates of having passed the examinations held by the Board.

(9) The Secretary shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Chairman.

(10) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these regulations, the Board may assign to any other officer or officers such duties of the Secretary as it may deem necessary.

(11) The post of the Secretary shall be a tenure post. The term of his appointment shall be three years and may be renewed.

3. The Controller of Examinations shall, subject to the control of the Chairman, be in charge of the examination sector of the Board, and shall—

(i) make arrangements for the conduct of all examinations of the Board;

(i1) conduct official correspondence of the Board relating to the examinations; and

(iii) | perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Chairman from time to time.

4. (1) The Academic Committee shall consist of—

(i) the Chairman of the Board;

(i1) the Director of Education, Quetta;

(iii) a University Professor nominated by the

Vice-Chancellor of the Punjab

University;

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a University Professor nominated by the  
Vice-Chancellor of the West Pakistan  
Agriculture University, Lyallpur;

a University Professor nominated by the  
Vice-Chancellor of the University of  
Engineering and Technology, Lahore;

the Principal, Polytechnic Institute,  
Quetta;

one representative each of the following  
group of the Teaching Departments of the  
Punjab University nominated by the  
Controlling Authority namely:—

- (a) Humanities and Social Sciences;
- (b) Natural Sciences;
- (c) Mathematics;

(d) Islamic Studies and Oriental  
Languages;

(e) other Languages;

members of the Boards of Studies of the

Punjab University for the following

subjects to be nominated by the Vice-  
Chancellor:—

- (a) Medicine;
- (b) Commerce; and
- (c) Education;

the following members to be nominated  
by the Controlling Authority: —

(a) five Conveners of Committees of Courses;

(b) two principals of colleges, maintained by Government, of whom one shall be a woman;

(2) The members of the | Academic  
Committee, other than the ex-officio members, shall hold office  
for two years.

(3) No member appointed by virtue of his office  
shall continue to be a member if he ceases to hold that office.

(4) The quorum for the meetings of the Academic  
Committee shall be one-third of the total number of members, a  
fraction being counted as one.

(5) (a) The Academic Committee shall have the  
general superintendence and control of,  
and the responsibility for the maintenance  
of, the standards of teaching and  
examinations.

(b) | Without prejudice to the generally of the  
foregoing provisions and subject to such  
conditions as may be prescribed, the  
Academic Committee shall exercise the  
following powers and perform the  
following duties, namely: —

(i) determine the subject or subjects  
which shall be assigned to each

advise the Board on\_ the  
qualification of the teachers and

advise the Board on all academic  
matters, including the general

subject in respect of marks to be  
assigned to it, and the conditions  
to be fulfilled for passing an  
examination and for being placed  
in a particular division; and

exercise such other powers and  
perform such other duties as may  
be prescribed.

The Appointments Committee shall consist of—

(i) the Chairman of the Board;

(i1) the Vice-Chancellor of the University or

6. (1) The Finance Committee shall consist of—

(i) the Chairman of the Board;  
(i1) the Director of Education, Quetta;

(iii) one representative of the Finance  
Department, Government of  
‘TBalochistan]; and

(iv) two nominees of the Controlling  
Authority.

(2) The functions of the Finance Committee shall  
be—

(i) to examine the annual budget and advise  
the Board thereon; and

(i1) to review the financial position of the  
Board periodically and make  
recommendations to the Board for  
improving its finances.

(3) The members of the Finance Committee, other  
than the ex-officio members, shall hold office for two years.

(4) The quorum for the meetings of the Finance  
Committee shall be three.

7. (1) There shall be a Committee for the Appointment  
of Paper Setters and Head Examiners which shall consist of—

(i) the Chairman of the Board;

(i1) the Vice-Chancellor of the Punjab  
University or his nominee who should be

(2) The functions of the Committee for the Appointment of Paper Setters and Head Examiners shall be to appoint Paper Setters and Head Examiners for all examinations conducted by the Board, after, considering — the recommendations of the Committee of Courses in this behalf; provided that where a Committee of Courses does not make its recommendations within the time specified by the Committee for Appointment of Paper Setters and Head Examiners, the Committee will make these appointments without the

recommendations of the Committee of Courses.

8. (1) There shall be a Committee of Courses for each subject or a group of allied subjects included in the courses of studies organized by the Board. Each such Committee shall consist of the following, namely:—

(i) two teachers of the subject or subjects from among the teachers of Intermediate colleges, nominated by the Academic Committee;

(ii) | two teachers of the subject or subjects from among the teachers of Secondary Schools, nominated by the Academic Committee;

(iii) two persons having experience of Intermediate education, or Secondary education, nominated by the Board; and

(iv) one expert in the subject or subjects nominated by the Chairman:

Provided that if in any subject the required number of teachers is not available, the Chairman may decide that the number of members of the Committee of Courses for that subject may be less than seven or may permit the nomination of suitable persons, who are not teachers, as members of particulars Committee of Courses.

(2) The term of office of the members of the Committee of Courses shall be two years:

Provided that if a vacancy occurs in the Committee during the course of two years the member appointed to fill the vacancy shall hold office for the remaining term only.

(3) Each Committee of Courses shall consider academic matters relating to the subject or subjects with which it is concerned and shall recommend to the Academic Committee the courses of study and text-books to be prescribed as well as the conditions to be fulfilled by the candidates for passing the relevant examination in the subject or subjects.

(4) Each Committee of Courses shall have a Convener who shall be nominated by the Board.

committee, he shall cease to be a member of any sub-committee of which he may be a member by virtue of his membership of that committee.

Recognition of 10. (1) The Board shall accord recognition, for the schools. Secondary School Examination, to such schools as are within the jurisdiction of the Board, if it is satisfied, on the basis of the inspection report received in the case of schools maintained by the Government of Pakistan, from the Officer on Special Duty, Ministry of Education, Government of Pakistan, or any other authority appointed for the purpose by the said Ministry, and in the case of other schools, from the Divisional Inspector or Inspectress of schools of the Division concerned, that the conditions prescribed for recognition have been satisfactorily fulfilled.

(2) If the Board on the basis of a report, received, in the case of a school maintained by the Government of Pakistan, from the Officer on Special Duty, Ministry of Education, Government of Pakistan, or any other authority appointed for the purpose by that Ministry, and in the case of any other school, from the Divisional Inspector or Inspectress of Schools, is satisfied that the conditions of recognition have ceased to be fulfilled by any school recognised by it, the Board may, after giving the management of the school an opportunity of being heard, cancel the recognition.

(3) The Board may, if it considers necessary, arrange a special inspection of any school by any Inspection Committee appointed by it.

Audit. 11. (1) The Board shall appoint a whole-time Audit Officer as Auditor for the purpose of auditing the accounts and the bills to be paid from the funds of the Board. No expenditure shall be made from the funds of the Board unless the bill for its payment has been audited by the Auditor in conformity with the regulations and rules.

(2) The statement of accounts of the Board, signed by the Secretary and the Auditor, shall be submitted to Government within six months of the closing of the financial



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year.

(3) The accounts of the Board shall be audited once a year in conformity with the regulations and rules, by Auditors appointed by Government for this purpose.

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
