# THE RAILWAY STORES (UNLAWFUL POSSESSION) ORDINANCE, 1944.

ORDINANCE No. XIX OF 1944

[13 May, 1944]

An Ordinance to make special provision for the punishment of the offence of unlawful possession of railway stores.

WHEREAS an emergency has arisen which renders it necessary to make special provision for the punishment of the offence of unlawful possession of railway stores;

Now, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 72 of the Government of India Act, as set out in the Ninth Schedule to the Government of India Act, 1935 (26 Geo. 5,c.2.), the Governor General is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance:—

1. Short title, extent and commencement.—(1) This Ordinance may be called the Railway Stores (Unlawful Possession) Ordinance, 1944.

1[(2) It extends to the whole of Pakistan. ]

(3) It shall come into force at once.

2. Definitions. In this Ordinance 7\* \* \* “railway stores” includes any article used or intended to be used in the construction, operation or maintenance of a railway.

3. Unlawful possession of railway Stores. Whoever is found or is proved to have been in possession of any article of railway stores shall, if the Court sees reasonable grounds for believing such article to be or to have been the property of the administration of any 7\* railway, unless he proves that the article came into his possession lawfully, be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to five years or with fine or with both.
