Acts, Ordinances, President’s Orders and Regulations

Islamabad, the 27th April, 1974

The following Acts of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 2nd April, 1974, and are hereby published for general information :—

Le ACT No. XXIII oF 1974

An Act to provide for the establishment of a University Grants Commission

Wuereas, in the interest of educational planning and laying down a uniform policy as also to secure coordination between the universities, it is expedient to provide for the establishment of a University Grants Commission and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto ;

It is hereby enacted as follows :—

1. Short title, extemt and commencement.—(1) This Act may be called the University Grants Commission Act, 1974.

(2) It extends to the whole of Pakistan.

(3) It shall come into force at once.

2. Definitions.—In this Act unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

~ (a) “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Commission ;

(b) “Commission” means the University Grants Commission established under section 3;

(c) “committee” means a committee constituted under section 13;

\* (d) “Controlling Authority” means the Federal Minister in charge of the Ministry of Education ;

(e) “fund” means the fund constituted under section 11;

(4) The Commission shall also submit to the Federal Government after the end of every year a report of its activities during that year and the Federal Government shall cause the report to be laid before each House of Parliament.

12. Appointment of officers, employees, etc.—For the efficient performance of its functions, the Commission may appoint its employees and, with the prior approval of the Controlling Authority, advisers and officers, on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed.

13. Committees.—(1) The Commission shall have the following committees, namely :—

- (a) Vice-Chancellors Committee ;
- (b) Pakistan Universities Co-ordination Council;
- (c) Pakistan Universities Sports Board ;
- (a) Equivalence Committee ;
- (e) Finance Committee ;
- (f) Planning and Development Committee ;
- (g) Higher Education Committee ; and
- th) any other committee which the Commission may deem proper to set up.

(2) The composition and functions of a committee shall be such as the Commission may determine.

14. Authentication of decisions, etc.—All decisions of the Commission shall be authenticated by the signature of the Chairman or of any other member authorised by the Commission in this behalf and all other orders or instruments issued or executed by or on behalf of the Commission shall be authenticated by the signature of an officer of the Commission authorised by it.

15. Rules.—The Commission may, with the prior approval of the Controlling Authority, by notification in the official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.

An Act to provide for the establishment of centres of excellence in the universities for conducting high-level teaching and research.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the establishment of centres of excellence in the universities for conducting high-level teaching and research ;

It is hereby enacted as follows :—

1. Short title, extent and commencement.—(1) This Act may be called the Centres of Excellence Act, 1974.

(2) It extends to the whole of Pakistan.

(3) It shall come into force at once.

2. Definitions.—In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(a) “Board” means a Board of Governors referred to. in sub-section (1) of section §;

(b) “Centre” means a Centre of Excellence established under section 3;

(c) “Commission” means the University Grants Commission established or to be established under the law providing for the establishment of such Commission ;

(d) “Director” means the Director of a Centre;

(e) “regulations” means regulations made under section 11; and

(£) “rules” means rules made under section ro.

3. Establishment of Centre—As soon as may be after the commencement of this Act, the Federal Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, establish a Centre of Excellence in a University specified in the notification.

4. Functions of Centre—A Centre shall—

(a) engage in goal-oriented high-level teaching and research ;

(b) train research worke le. Dard: heer

(c) establish M. Phil. programmes in the relevant discipline in accordance with the standard and requirements of the University in which the Centre is established ;

(d) promote co-operation in interdisciplinary relationship with other teaching and research establishment ;

(ec) arrange conferences, seminars and refresher courses for the development of teaching and research; and

(f) conduct teaching and research in such particular discipline as\_ is assigned to it by the Federal Government.[~——~——~

5. Board of Governors—(1) The management, overall! control and supervision of the affairs of a Centre established in a University shall vest in a Board of Governors consisting of the following members, namely :—

(a) Vice-Chancellor of the University, who shall also be its Chairman.

(b) A representative of the Commission.

(c) A representative of the Pakistan Science Foundation.

(d) A representative of the Ministry of Education.

(c) institute fellowships for promotion of research in the discipline concerned ;

(d) create, suspend or abolish such posts as may be necessary ;

(e) appoint teachers and other officers; and

(f) hold, control and administer the funds of the Centre.

(3) A member of the Board referred to in paragrapli (f) of sub-clause (1) shall hold office tor such term as may be determined by the Federal Government.

(4) The meetings of the Board shall be held as and when called by the Chairman :

\_ Provided that not less than two meetings shall be held in each year.

(s) In the exercise of its powers and the performance of its functions, a Board shall be subject to such special or general instructions as may be issued by the Commission from time to time.

(6) The Board may, for the speedy and efficient working of the Centre, delegate to the Director such of its powers as it may deem necessary.

(3) The Director shall perform such other functions and exercise such powers as may be assigned or delegated to him by the Board.

7. Academic Comuittee—(1) At cach Centre, there shall be an Academic Committee consisting of the following members, namely :—

(a) Director of the Centre, who shall also be its Convener.

(b) All Professors and Associate Professors of the Centre.

(c) Two experts to be nominated by the Commission.

(2) The Committee may [associate] such other experts as it may consider necessary.

(3) The Committee shall prepare and submit to the Board the academic and research programmes of the Centre.

8. Fund.—Each Centre shall have a fund to which shall be credited—

(a) grants made by the Federal Government, the Provincial Governments and the Commission ;

(b) contributions and donations from individuals, local bodies, corporations, institutions, organizations and agencies; and

(c) income from fees.

9. Audit and accounts, etc.—(1) The accounts of a Centre shall be maintained in such form and manner as may be prescribed by rules.

(2) The accounts of a Centre shall be audited once in every year by an auditor appointed by the Commission on such remuneration, if any, to be paid by the Centre, as the Commission may fix.

(3) A Centre shall submit, through the Commission, to the Federal Government a copy of its audited annual accounts, together with the observations of the Director, if any, thereon, and a report on the activities of the Centre during the preceding year.

(4) A Centre shall furnish to the Federal Government such information relating to its activities as may be asked for by the Federal Government from time to time.

\_\_\_ 11, Power to make regulations.—A Centre may, with the approval of the 'Commission, make such regulations] not inconsistent with the rules, as it may consider necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Act.
