SINDH ACT NO. XI OF 2004  
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An Act to provide for the establishment of the “UNIVERSITY OF EAST” at Hyderabad.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the establishment of the “UNIVERSITY OF EAST” Hyderabad and matters ancillary thereto;

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

CHAPTER—I

1. (a) This Act may be called the “UNIVERSITY OF EAST” Act, 1999.

(b) It shall come into force at once.

2. In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or

context—

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“affiliated institute or college” means an institution or College affiliated to the University but not maintained or administered by it;

“Authority” means any of the Authorities specified in this Act;

“Board” means the Board of Governors of the University;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of a Teaching Department.

“Chancellor” means the Chancellor of the University;

“Council” means the “Academic Council” of the University;

“Dean” means the Chairman of the Board of Faculty;

“Director” means the head of teaching or administrative division;

“East” means Engineering, Arts, Science and Technology;

“Faculty” means a Faculty of the University;

“SOCIETY” means the “Hasrat Mohani Educational Society”;

"Government" means the Government of Sindh;

Definitions.

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- (m) "Institution" means a University, college, institute, center, or school that offers higher education programs;
- (n) "Member" means an institution duly admitted by the Council as its member;
- (o) "Prescribed" means prescribed by Statutes, regulations or rules;
- (p) "Professor Emeritus" means a retired Professor working in the University in an honorary capacity;
- (q) "statutes/ regulations/rules" means statutes/ regulations/rules made under this Act;
- (tr) "Teaching Department" means a Teaching Department of University;
- (s) "teachers" means whole time teacher engaged as Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professors, and such other persons as may be declared to be the Teacher;
- (t) "University" means the "UNIVERSITY OF EAST"; and
- (u) "Vice-Chancellor" means the Vice-Chancellor of the University.

CHAPTER—II  
THE UNIVERSITY

- (a) There shall be established a University to be called the "UNIVERSITY OF EAST" at Hyderabad, consisting of the Chancellor, the Vice Chancellor, Deans, Chairman of the Teaching Department, members of the Board, the members of the Academic Council and such other officers as may be prescribed.
- (b) The main Campus of the University will be at Hyderabad and the University shall take necessary measures to set up Campus/Campuses within the Province of Sindh the Hyderabad Division.
- (c) The "UNIVERSITY" shall be, owned, managed and administered by the "SOCIETY" and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal, and may sue and be sued by the said name.

Incorporation

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(d) The University shall be competent to acquire and hold property, both movable and immovable, to lease, sell or otherwise transfer any property which may have become vested in or been acquired by it.

(e) The University shall be open to all persons of either sex, any religion, race, creed, colour or domicile who are academically qualified;

(f) The moral and ethical codes employed on the University campus, and the constituent/affiliated institutions will be based on and derived from the cardinal principles and the guidance embodied in the Holy Quran and the Sunnah of the Prophet (peace be upon him).

The University shall have the powers to—

(a) provide for instructions in such branches of learning as it may deem fit and to make provisions for the advancement and dissemination of knowledge in such manner as it may determine; provided that the faculty of Medicine may be set up as per requirements of the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council;

(b) prescribe courses of studies and curricula;

(c) admit and hold examination at all levels including Matriculation and Intermediate levels and to award and confer degree/ diplomas/certificate and other academic distinction to and on the persons who have been admitted to and have passed its examination under prescribed condition;

(d) confer honorary degree/distinctions on approved persons as prescribed;

(e) affiliate and disaffiliate educational institution under prescribed condition;

(f) establish faculties, teaching departments, research institute and other learning centers in the ordinated branches of learning and to provide and support other facilities for education, professional training and research;

institute Professorship, Associate Professorship, Assistant  
Professorship and Lecturership, and any other posts and to  
appoint persons thereto;

create posts for research, extension, administration and other  
related purposes and to appoint persons thereto;

institute and award fellowships, scholarships exhibitions,  
medals and prizes under prescribed conditions;

control the residence of the students of the University, to  
institute and maintain halls of residence and to approve or  
license hostels and lodgings;

supervise and control the discipline of the students, to  
promote the extra-curricular and recreational activities of  
such students, and to make arrangement for promoting their  
health and general welfare;

demand and receive such fees and other charges as it may  
determine;

enter into, carry out, vary or cancel contracts;

receive and manage property transferred and grants,

bequests trusts, gifts, donations, endowments or other contributions made to the University and to invest any funds representing such property, grants bequests trusts, gifts, donations, endowments or contributions in such manner as it may deem fit;

undertake such research as it may determine in the all branches of learning;

provide for the printing and publication of research and other works;

appoint members of the various bodies and committees, as the board may determine, for academic and administrative activities;

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- (t) appoint such officers and staff and prescribe terms and conditions, and powers and duties of such officers and staff;
- (u) all such other acts and things, as may be requisite to further its objective.

OFFICERS OF THE UNIVERSITY

The following shall be the officers of the University: — Officers of University

- (a) the Chancellor;
- (b) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (c) the Deans;
- (d) the Directors;
- (e) the Chairman of the Teaching Departments;
- (f) the Registrar;
- (g) the Director of Finance;
- (h) the Controller of Examination;
- (i) the Librarian; and
- (j) such persons as may be prescribed by the regulations.

The Governor of Sindh shall be the Patron of the University. Patron of University.

- (a) When present, the Patron shall, preside the Convocation of the university.
- (b) Proposal of an honorary degree shall be subject to confirmation by the Patron.

(a) The SOCIETY shall nominate one of its Directors, who shall The Chancellor.

preferably be a person of eminence in letters, science or social work, to be the Chancellor of the University for a period of three years, which may be extended by the SOCIETY.

The Chancellor shall, in the absence of the Patron, preside at the Convocation of the University.

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(c) The Chancellor may remove any person from the membership of any Authority if such person:-

- (i) has become of unsound mind; or
- (ii) has been incapacitated to function as member; or
- (iii) has been convicted by a court of law in Pakistan or abroad of an offense involving moral turpitude.

(d) If the Chancellor is satisfied that the proceedings of an Authority or orders of any office is not in accordance with the provisions of this Act, the statutes, the regulations, or the rules, he may, after calling upon such Authority to show cause why such proceedings should not be annulled, by order in writing, annul such proceedings or orders.

(e) Should the Chancellor be incapacitated from acting as such due to absence or any other cause, the Vice Chancellor shall exercise all the power and perform all the duties and functions of the Chancellor.

(f) The Chancellor may cause a visitation/inquiry in respect of matters connected with affairs of the University and appoint persons as may deem fit for the purpose.

(g) The Chancellor shall, on receipt of a report under sub-section (F), shall above issue such directions as he thinks fit and the Vice Chancellor will comply with such directions through the board.

(a) The Vice-Chancellor shall be appointed by the Chancellor. The Vice Chancellor for a period of three years, which the Chancellor may further

extended, on such terms and conditions as the Chancellor may determine.

(b) At any time when the office of the Vice Chancellor is vacant.

(c) or is unable to perform the functions of his office for any reason whatsoever, the Chancellor shall make such arrangements for the performance of the duties of the Vice Chancellor as he may deem fit.

(a) The Vice Chancellor shall be the principal executive Powers and Duties of academic officers of the University and shall be responsible for the vice Chancellor. implementation of the provisions of the Act, the statutes, the regulations and the rules and execution of the policies and the programs of the University.

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The Vice Chancellor shall, in the absence of the Chancellor, preside over the meetings of the Authorities of which the Chancellor is the Chairman.

The Vice Chancellor may, in an emergency which in his opinion requires immediate action, take such action as he consider necessary and shall, as soon thereafter be possible, report his action to the officer, authority or other body which in the ordinary course, would have dealt with the matter.

In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers, the Vice Chancellor shall also have the powers to: -

- (i) create and fill temporary posts for a period not exceeding six months;
- (ii) sanction all expenditure provided for in the approved budget and to re-appropriate funds within the same major head of expenditure;
- (iii) sanction by re-appropriation an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand rupees for an unforeseen item not provided for in the budget and report it to the Board at the next meeting;
- (iv) appoint paper setters and examiners for all examinations of the University after receiving panels of names from the relevant authorities;
- (v) make such arrangements for the scrutiny of papers, marks and results as may be consider necessary;
- (vi) — direct teachers, officers and other employees of the University to take up such assignments in connection with teaching, research, examination, administration and such other activities in the university as he may consider necessary;
- (vii) appoint employees of such categories in respect of which power have been delegated to him by the Board;
- (viii) delegate, subject to such conditions, if any as may be prescribed, any of his powers under this Act, to an officer or other employee of the University; and



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(ix) exercise and perform such other powers and functions as may be prescribed.

10. (a) The Registrar shall be a whole-time officer of the University appointed by the Board on such terms and conditions as the Board may determine.

(b) The Registrar shall be the custodian of the common seal and the academic records of the University; and

(c) Perform such other duties as may be prescribed.

11. (a) The Director of Finance shall be a whole-time officer of the

University appointed by the Board on such terms and conditions as the Board may determine.

(b) The Director shall:-

(i) manage the property/finances and \_\_ the investments of the University;

(ii) prepare the annual/revised budget estimates and present them to the Finance Committee and the Board;

(iii) Ensure that the funds are expended for the purpose for which they are provided; and

(iv) Perform such other duties as may be prescribed.

12. The Controller of Examination shall be a whole-time officer of the University and shall be responsible for all matters connected with the conduct of examination and perform such other duties may be prescribed.

13. The Auditor shall be a whole-time officer of the University and shall be responsible for pre-audit of all payments from the university fund.

14. The Director of Planning and Development shall be a whole time officer of the University. He shall be responsible for planning and development of the University and shall also be responsible for preparation of short and long-term development plans for the resources. The facilities and the amenities, and shall perform such functions as may be prescribed.

CHAPTER—IV

AUTHORITIES OF THE UNIVERSITY

15. The following shall be the Authorities of the Universities:--

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The Board of Governors;

the Academic Council;

the Boards of Faculties;

the Boards of Studies;

the Selection Board;

the Board of Advanced Studies and Research;

the Finance and Planning Committee;

Discipline Committee; and

such other authorities as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

16. (a) The Board of Governors shall consist of—

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the Vice Chancellor, shall be its Chairman;

the Chief Justice of the High Court of Sindh or a Judge of the High Court nominated by him;

two Members of the Provincial Assembly of Sindh to be nominated by the Provincial Assembly of Sindh;

vice Chancellor, or their nominees, of Mehran Engineering University and the University of Sindh;

one or more Deans to be appointed by the Chancellor on the recommendation of the Vice Chancellor;

Secretary of the Government of Sindh, Education Department; two members of outstanding merit nominated by the Society;

two members of outstanding merit to be nominated by the Mehran Education Foundation;

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four persons of eminence representing various disciplines and profession nominated by the Chancellor on recommendation of the Vice Chancellor;

Chairman University Grants Commission or his nominee;

the registrar who shall act as its Secretary;

(b) Member of the Board other than ex-officio members shall hold

office for three years and shall be eligible for re-nomination.

17. (a) The Board shall be executive body and under the provisions of this

Act,

exercise general supervision over the affairs and

management of the University;

(b) Without prejudice to the generality of the forgoing powers, and subject to the provisions of this Act, and the statutes, the Board shall have the powers to:—

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hold, control and administer the property and of funds the University;

govern and regulate, with due regard to the advice of the Finance and Planning Committees the finances, accounts and investments of the University and for that purpose, to appoint such agents as it may think fit;

consider annual/revised budget estimates and to advise the society thereon, and to re-appropriate funds from one head of expenditure to another.

transfer and accept transfer of movable or immovable property on behalf of the University;

enter into, vary, carry out and cancel on behalf of the University;

cause proper books of accounts to be kept for all sums of money received and expended by the University and for the assets and liabilities of the University.

**Powers and Duties of  
the Board.**

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receive and manage any property transferred and grants, bequests, donations, endowments and other contributions made to the University;

administer any funds placed at the disposal of the University for specified purpose.

determine the form, provide for the custody and regulate the use of the common seal of the University;

provide the buildings, libraries, premises, furniture, apparatus, equipment and other means required for carrying out the work of the University;

establish and maintain halls of residence and hostels or approve or license hostels or lodgings for the residence of the students;

to affiliate and disaffiliate educational institutions and colleges;

institute Professorship, Associate Professorship, Assistant Professorship, Lecturership and other teaching posts or to suspend or abolish such posts;

create, suspend or abolish such administrative, teaching,

research or other posts as may be necessary;

make appointments on recommendation of the Selection Board to the posts of teachers, officers and such others cadres as may be determined;

appoint Emeritus and Distinguish Professors on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed;

confer Honorary Degrees in accordance with the conditions prescribed;

prescribe duties of officers/teachers, & other employees of the University;

suspend, punish and remove from service officers (other than the Vice Chancellor), teachers and other employees in the manner prescribed;

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(xx) appoint members of the various Authorities in accordance with the provisions of this Act;

(xxi) propose statutes for submission of the Chancellor;

(xxii) consider and dispose of the regulations made by Academic, provided that the Board may frame a regulation on its own initiative and approve it after consulting the Academic Council;

(xxiii) regulate, determine and administer all other matters concerning the University, and to this end exercise all other powers not specifically mentioned in this Act, & the statutes;

(xxiv) delegate any of its powers to an Authority or Officer or a Committee the Sub-Committee; and

(xxv) — perform such other functions as have been assigned to it under this Act, or may be assigned to it by the statutes.

(a) The Board shall meet at least four times in a year. Dates of meeting are to be fixed by the Vice Chancellor. Special meetings may however be called at any time on the direction of the Chancellor or on a requisition made by not less than four members of the Board to consider a matter of urgent nature.

(b) Not less than ten clear days' notice of a special meeting shall be given to the members of the Board, and the agenda of the meeting shall be restricted to the matter for which the special meeting is called.

(c) The quorum for a meeting of the Board shall be one half of its members, a fraction being counted as one.

(d) The decision of the Board shall be expressed in terms of the views of the majority of members present and voting and, if the members are equally divided, the Chairman of the Board shall have and exercise a casting vote.

20. (a) The Academic Council shall be the highest academic body of the  
University, and shall, subject to the provisions of this Act and  
the Statutes, have the powers to lay down proper standards of  
instructions, scholarship, research and examinations, and to  
regulate and promote the academic life of the University;

(b) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the  
foregoing provisions, the Council shall have the powers—

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advise the Board on academic matters;

to regulate the admission of students to the courses of studies and examinations;

propose to the Board, scheme for the constitution & organization of teaching departments, institutes and faculties;

to consider or formulate proposals for the planning and development of teaching and research and in the University;

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(v) \_ to make regulations, on the recommendations of the Board of Faculties and the Board of Studies, prescribing the course of studies and the syllabi for all University Examinations; provided that, if the recommendations of Board of Faculties and Boards of Studies are not received by the prescribed date, the Council may, subject to the approval of the Board, continue for the next year the courses of studies already prescribed;

(vi) to recognize the Examinations of other Universities or examining bodies as equivalent to the corresponding examinations of the University;

(vii) to frame Regulations for submission to the Board;

(viii) to appoint members to the various Authorities in accordance with the provisions of this Act; and

(ix) to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by Statutes.

CHAPTER—V  
STATUTES, REGULATIONS AND RULES

Subject to the provisions of this Act, Chancellor may, make/promulgate statutes to regulate or prescribe all or any of the following matter namely—

(a) terms and conditions of service, including pay, constitution of pension, insurance, gratuity, provident fund, benevolent fund and other fringe benefits;

(b) terms and conditions of contractual appointment;

(c) establishment of Faculties, and other academic units and divisions;

(d) affiliation and disaffiliation of institutions and related matters;

(e) powers and duties of officers and teachers;

(f) conditions under which the University may enter into arrangements with other organization for purposes of instruction, research and other scholarly activities;

No Statutes shall be valid until it has been approved by the  
Chancellor.

Subject to the provisions of this Act and the statutes, regulations  
may be made for all or any of the following matters: —

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the courses of study for degrees, diplomas and certificates of the University;

the admission of students to the University;

the conditions under which students shall be admitted and shall become eligible for the award of degrees, diplomas and certificates;

the conduct of examinations at any levels including matriculation & intermediate;

fees and other charges to be paid by students for admission to the courses of study and examination of the University;

the conduct and discipline of students of the University; conditions of residence of the students of the University or the colleges, including the levy of fees for residence in the halls of residence and hostels;

the approval and licensing of hostels and lodgings;

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(i) conditions under which a person should carry on independent research to entitle him to a degree;

Gj) the institution of fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, medals and prizes;

(k) the institutions of stipends and free and \_half-free assistantship;

(1) | the academic costumes and the use of the Library;

(m) the formation of Teaching Departments and Boards of Studies;

(n) all other matter which by this Act, and the statutes are to be or may be prescribed by regulations;

(o) the regulations shall be prepared by the Academic Council and shall be submitted to the Board which may approve them or withhold approval or refer them back to the Academic Council for reconsideration;

(p) A regulation prepared by the Academic Council shall not be valid, unless it receives the approval of the Board;

23. The procedure for adding to, amending or repealing the statutes and the regulations shall be the same as that prescribed respectively for framing or making the statutes and the regulations.

24. (a) The Authority and the other bodies of the University may make Rules consistent with this Act, Statutes and the Regulations, to regulate the conduct of their business and the time and place of meetings and related matters.

(i) Provided that the Board may direct the | amendments or the annulment of any rules, made by another Authority or body under this section:

(ii) Provided further that if such other Authority or body is dissatisfied with such directions it may appeal to the SOCIETY whose decision in the matter shall be final.

(b) The Board may make rules to regulate any matter relating to the affairs of the University, which has not been specifically provided for by this Act, the statutes or the regulations.

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25. (a) An educational institution applying for affiliation to the University shall make an application to the University and shall satisfy that it confirms to the requirements of affiliations set by the University;

(b) The procedure to be followed in disposing of an application for the affiliation of an educational institution grant or refusal or withdrawal of affiliation shall be such as may be prescribed.

(c) The affiliation Board may, after due inquiry after consultation with the Academic Council, give notice of its intention of withdrawing the affiliation if it is satisfied that the educational institution fails at any time to fulfil any of the requirements of affiliation or as failed to observe any of the conditions of affiliation.

(d) The affiliation shall not be refused or withdrawn unless the educational institution is given an opportunity of being heard.

CHAPTER —VI  
THE UNIVERSITY FUND

26. (a) The University shall have a fund to which shall be credited from its income of fees, donations, trusts, bequests, endowments, grants, contributions and all other sources.

(b) Capital and recurrent expenditure of the University shall be met from the contributions made by the SOCIETY, including other societies, universities, associations/societies or individuals & from the income derived from any sources.

(c) No contribution/donation/grant which may directly or indirectly involve any immediate or subsequent financial liability for the University or which may not include on activity in the program for the time being shall be accepted without the prior approval of the Board.

(d) The account of the University shall be maintained in such manner as may be determined by the Board & shall be audited each year within four months of the closing of the financial year by the Chartered Accountant appointed by the Board.

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(e) The accounts, together with the report of the auditor thereon, shall be submitted to the Board for approval.

(f) The auditor's report shall certify it has been complied with the

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standards of audit & certification of the "institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan".

## CHAPTER—VII

### GENERAL PROVISIONS

An employee of the University shall retire from service on such

date, after he has completed twenty five years of service qualifying for pension or other retirement benefits, as the competent authority may direct, provided that no employee shall be retired unless he has been informed in writing of the grounds the actions proposed to be taken against him and has been given reasonable opportunity of showing cause against that action; or on completion of sixty years of his age where no direction is given.

Except as otherwise provided, no employee of the University holding a permanent post, shall be reduced in rank, or removed or compulsorily retired from service, unless he has been given a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken against him.

Where the order is passed punishing an employee (Other than Vice Chancellor) of the University or altering or interpreting to his, dis-advantage the prescribed terms or conditions of his service, he shall, where the order passed by the Vice Chancellor or any other officer or Teacher of the University, have the right to appeal to the Board, against the order, and, where the order is made by the Board, have the right to apply to Board for review.

The appeal or application for review shall be submitted to the Vice Chancellor who shall lay it before the Board with his views and record of the case.

No order in appeal or review shall be made unless the appellant or the applicant, as the case may be, has been given an opportunity of being heard.

Any casual vacancy among the appointed or nominated members of any Authority shall be filled as soon as conveniently may be, by the person or the body who appointed or nominated the member whose place has become vacant.

where a vacancy in the membership of an Authority, other than the Board, cannot be filled for the reason that the member was ex-officio, and the office has ceased to exist.

or for any other circumstances, which make it impracticable to fill the vacancy, the vacancy shall be filled in such manner as the Chancellor may direct on the recommendation of the Board.

(c) The officer of a nominated member shall become vacant if he resigns or fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Authority without sufficient cause of leave of absence, or his nomination is changed by the nominating Authority.

nominated or appointed to any Authority shall cease to be a member of such Authority as soon as he has ceased to hold the position by virtue of which he was nominated or appointed.

(b) If a question arises whether any person is entitled to be a member of any Authority, the matter shall be referred to a committee consisting of the Vice-Chancellor, Justice High Court of Sindh who is the member of the Board and a nominee of the Chancellor, and the decision of the committee shall be final and binding.

The constitution, function and power of other Authority for which no specific provision or insufficient provision has been made in this Act, shall be such as may be prescribed by the statutes.

The Board, the Academic Council or other Authorities may appoint such Standing, Special or Advisory Committees, as they may consider advantageous in the performance of their functions.

. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the Statutes set out in the Schedule, shall be deemed to be the Statutes framed under section 21 and shall remain in force until they are amended or replaced by new statutes framed in accordance with this Act.

If any difficulty arises as to the first constitution or reconstitution of any Authority upon coming into force of this Act or otherwise in giving effect to any provision of this Act the Chancellor may give appropriate directions to remove such difficulty.

No act, proceeding, resolution or decision of any Authority shall be invalid by reason only of any vacancy or defect in the constitution of, or in the appointment or nomination of any member of the Authority.

. (a) No Court shall have jurisdiction to entertain any proceeding, grant any injunction or make any order in relation to anything done in good faith or purported to have been done or intended to be done under this Act.

(b) No suit or legal proceedings shall lie against Government, the University or any Authority or an employee of Government or the University or any person, in respect of anything which is done, or purported to have been done in good faith or is

SCHEDULE  
THE FIRST STATUTES

(See section 34)

1. (a) The University shall have the following Faculties:— Faculties.

(i) 'The Faculty of Medical Science

(ii) The Faculty of Engineering

(iii) The Faculty of Management Science

(iv) | The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences

(v) Such other Faculties as may be prescribed by the statutes.

(b) Each Faculty shall include such institutes, teaching departments,

centres, or other teaching or research units as may be prescribed

by statutes.

2. (a) There shall be a Board of each Faculty consisting of— The Board Faculty.

of

(i) | The Dean;

(ii) The Professors, the Directors and the Chairman of the Teaching Department comprised in the Faculty; and

(iii) three teachers to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor by reason of their specialized knowledge of subjects which, though not assigned to the Faculty.

(b) The members, mentioned in sub-clause a(iii) above shall hold office for three years.

(c) The quorum for a meeting of the Board of a Faculty shall be one half of the total number of members, fractions being counted as

one.

(d) The Board of each Faculty shall, subject to the general control of the Academic Council and the Board, have the powers to: -

(i) co-ordinate the teaching and research in the subjects

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assigned to the Faculty;

(ii) scrutinise the schemes of courses and syllabi proposed by the Board of Studies comprised in the Faculty, and forward to the Academic Council alongwith its observations;

(iii) scrutinise the recommendations made by of the Board of Studies comprised in the Faculty, on the appointment of paper setters and examiners, except for research and degrees examiners who shall be Scrutinized by Vice

Chancellors;

(iv) consider any other academic matter relating to the faculty and to report there on the Academic Council; and

(v) perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

3. There shall be a dean of each Faculty who shall be the Chairman and \_ Deans. conveyer of the Board of Faculty. The Dean of a Faculty

(a) \_ shall be appointed by the Chancellor on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor from amongst the three senior most Professors in the Faculty, for a term of three years and shall be eligible for another term.

(b) shall present candidates for admission to degrees, except honorary degrees, to the Chancellor in the courses falling within the purview of the Faculty.

(c) | shall exercise such powers & perform such duties as may be prescribed.

4. (a) There shall be a Teaching Department for each subject or a group of Teaching Department. subjects as may be prescribed by the regulations and each Teaching Department shall be headed by a Chairman.

(b) The Chairman of a teaching department shall be appointed by the Board on the recommendation of the Vice Chancellor from amongst the three most senior Professors and three most senior Associate Professors of the department for a period of three years.

(c) Provided that where there is no Professor or Associate Professor in a department, it shall be looked after by the Dean of the Faculty with the assistance of the most senior teacher of the department.

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(d) The Chairman of the Department shall plan, organise and supervise

the work of the Department and shall be responsible to the Dean for the work of his Department.

5. (a) There shall be a Separate Board of Studies for each subject or group of Board of Studies.

subjects as may be prescribed by the Regulations.

(b) Each Board of Studies shall consist of—

(i) | The Chairman of the Department who shall act its chairman and conveyor.

(ii) All Professors and Associate Professors in the Department or the Institute;

(iii) Three teachers, other than University teachers to be appointed by the Faculty Board. The number will be determined by the Faculty Board according to the needs of each Board; and

(iv) three experts to be appointed by the Vice Chancellor.

(c) The term of office of members of the Board of Studies, other than ex-officio members shall be three years.

(d) The quorum for a meeting of the Board of Studies, shall be one half of the total numbers of a fraction being counted as one.

6. (a) To advice authorities on all academic matters connected with instructions, research and examinations in the subject or — subjects concerned;

(b) To propose curricula and syllabi for all degrees, diploma and certificate courses in the subject or subjects concerned;

(c) To suggest a panel of names of paper setters and examiners in the subject or subjects concerned; and

(d) To perform such other functions as may be prescribed by the Regulations.

7. (a) The advanced studies and research Board shall consist of—

(i) The Vice Chancellor who shall be the Chairman;

(ii) The Deans;

(iv) | Three Scholars of eminence in a field not represented on the Board of Advanced Studies and Research.

(b) The term of office of the members of the Board of Advanced Studies and Research Board, other than ex-officio members, shall be three years.

(c) The quorum for a meeting of Board of the Advanced Studies and Research Board shall be one half of the total number of members, a fraction being counted as one.

8. The functions of the Advanced Studies and Research Boards shall be—

(a) to advise the Authorities on all matters connected with the promotion of advanced studies and Research in the University;

(b) To consider and report to the authorities on the institution of research degree in the University;

(c) To appoint supervisors for research studies;

(d) To propose regulations for award of research degree; and

(e) To recommend the name of examiners for research degrees;

9. (a) There shall be a Selection Board consisting of—

(i) The Vice Chancellor who shall be the Chairman;

(ii) One member of the Board and two persons of eminence to be nominated by the Board; provided that none of them is an employee of the University;

(iii) the Dean of the Faculty concerned;

(iv) the Chairman of the Teaching Department concerned; and

(v) one person to be nominated by the SOCIETY.

(b) Member of the Selection Board, other than ex-officio members, shall hold office for three years;

(c) The quorum for a meeting of the Selection Board shall be five members;

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(d) No member of the Selection Board who is a candidate for the post to which appointment is to be made shall take part in such proceedings of the Board;

(e) In selecting candidates as Professors and Associate Professors, the Selection Board shall, co-opt or consult three experts in the subject concerned. In selecting candidates for other teaching posts, two experts in the subject concerned. The expert will be nominated by the Vice Chancellor, from a standing list of experts approved by the Board on recommendations of Selection Board.

10. (a) The function of the Selection Board shall be to consider all applications for teaching and other posts received in response to an advertisement and shall recommend to the Board the names of suitable candidates for appointment.

(b) Recommend to the Board the grant of a higher initial pay in a suitable case for reasons to be recorded in writing.

(c) The Selection Board may recommend to the Board the appointment of an eminently qualified person to a position in the University on the terms and conditions as may be prescribed.

(d) The Selection Board shall consider all cases of promotion of officers of the University and recommend to the Board the names of suitable candidates for such promotions.

(e) In the event of an unresolved difference of opinion between the Selection Board and the Board, the matter shall be referred to the Chancellor whose decision shall be final.

11. (a) There shall be a Finance and Planning Committee consisting of:—

(i) Two nominees of the SOCIETY;  
(ii) | One nominee of the Board;

(iii) | Three experts in the field of finance and planning to be nominated by the Chancellor;

(iv) one Dean on recommendation of the Vice Chancellor to be nominated by the Chancellor;

(v) The Director Finance who shall act as its Secretary.

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(b) The quorum for a meeting of the Finance and Planning Committee shall be four members.

12. The functions of the Finance and Planning Committee shall be— Functions of the Finance and Planning Committee.

(a) to consider annual statement of accounts and revised budget estimates and advice the Board thereon;

(b) to review periodically the financial position of the University;

(c) to advise the Board on planning, development Finance, Investments and accounts of the University;

(d) to prepare short term and long term development plans;

(e) to prepare resource development plans; and

(f) to prepare such other functions as may be prescribed by Statutes.

13. (a) There shall be an Affiliation Committee consisting of— Affiliation Committee.

(i) the Vice Chancellor who shall be the Chairman;

(ii) One member of the Board to be nominated by the Board;

(iii) | Two Professors to be nominated by the Academic Council.

(b) The term of office of the members of the Committee excluding ex-officio members shall be two years.

(c) The Affiliation Committee may co-opt not more than three experts.

(d) The quorum for a meeting of or an inspection by the Vice Chancellor for this purpose shall act as the Secretary of the Committee.

(e) An officer of the University to be designated by the Vice Chancellor for this purpose shall act as the Secretary of the Committee.

14. (a) The discipline committee shall consist of— Discipline Committee and its functions.

(i) The Vice Chancellor or his nominee;

(ii) Two Professors to be nominated by the Academic Council;

- (iii) One member to be nominated by the SOCIETY; and
- (iv) The Teacher or Offices incharge of students Affairs by whatever name called who shall act as member Secretary.

(b) The term of office of the members of the Discipline Committee, other then ex-officio members, shall be two years.

(c) The quorum for a meeting of the Discipline Committee shall be three members.

15. The functions of the Discipline Committee shall be—

(a) To propose regulations to the Academic Council on the conduct of

University students, maintenance of discipline and for dealing with

cases of in discipline; and

(b) To perform such other functions as may be assigned to it by statutes or regulations.
